<u>Movement:</u> The Advisory will be responsible for the development of strategies that will involve the entertainment industry, HERO X, ZP and social media in creating a global movement for wellbeing. This unique component of our work sets us apart and will define our ultimate success.

<u>Metrics:</u> The Advisory is principally responsible for organizing existing data drawn from the Gallup International Wellbeing poll and OECD Better life index. The Advisory members will develop the parameters of our definition of wellbeing and developing the criteria for assessing a country(s)/region(s) state of readiness for optimal wellbeing.

<u>Products and services:</u> The Advisory is responsible for creating strategies that will enable participating organizations to deploy their products and services in support regional or countrywide wellbeing objectives. The Advisory will also develop methods to enable the WWW platform to support research/development and testing of new

products and services in a safe environment.

<u>International relationships:</u> The Advisory will work across all of the other Advisories to ensure WWW is truly global. Delegates will develop strategies to build on existing wellbeing initiatives and create synergies and partnerships with other like minded organizations for profit and not for profit.

Business development: The Advisory will develop partnership and financial strategies to sustain our enterprise short and long term. Delegates will work with global for profit, not for profit, civil society and NGO's to frame our funding strategies in support of our objectives.
